

Summit Recycles

It's the law!

Recycling in Summit is:

'Green' for the environment - Financially beneficial for our city

Required by NJ State Law for all businesses and residents—in both single and multi-family dwellings

At Curbside

Items should be placed at the curb before 7 AM on your zone's recycling day. Collection is every other Thursday. Please check the other side of this flyer for your collection dates.

WHAT

HOW



Mixed Paper & Newspapers - If it rips, recycle it. Including:

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Catalogs and junk mail
- Envelopes
- Colored and white paper
- Shirt boxes
- Books (hard covers removed)
- Phone books
- Clean food boxes (Cereal, etc.)
- Cardboard egg cartons
- Milk and juice cartons
- Juice boxes.

All paper may be combined and placed in brown paper bags or in bins or cross-tied with twine.

Shredded paper should be placed in **clear** plastic bags.



Plastic, Cans, Glass - Co-Mingled Materials, including:

- Plastic containers with coded triangles 1 & 2 (including laundry and personal care product bottles)
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminum & Steel beverage and food cans
- Empty, clean latex paint cans
- Empty aerosol cans

All of these materials may be placed in the same bin.

Plastic bottles should be flattened.

"Bring your plastics marked 1-7 to the Transfer Station. The city is investigating providing curb pick-up of these items in the future."

NO: Styrofoam, plastic bags, motor oil or antifreeze bottles, ceramics, window glass, light bulbs, mirrors, hangers, aluminum trays and foil.



Corrugated Cardboard - Including:

- Shipping boxes
- Clean pizza boxes

Should be flattened and cross-tied with string/twine.



Batteries All dry cell batteries, including:

- AA, AAA, C, D
- 9-Volt
- Lantern
- Button
- Ni-Cad and other rechargeable batteries

Place batteries in a **clear** plastic bag on top of your mixed paper recycling.

At Transfer Station / Municipal Disposal Area (New Providence Ave.)

The following items are recyclable at this location only, not curbside. The above items preferably should be left at the curb. But if you miss your pick up date, you may bring them to the Recycling Center (behind the Transfer Station).

Household Electronics - Including:

- Computers, Printers & Keyboards
- TVs & Monitors
- Radios, Stereos & VCRs
- Phones & Faxes
- Copiers
- Electric Power Tools

Place in transfer station building

Fluorescent tubes and Compact fluorescent bulbs

Place in cardboard tubes provided near electronics area

Car & Boat Batteries (lead-acid)

Place at electronics area
